


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CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS

8TH GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS-MS. HENDRICKSON







This week, students began building a solid foundation to analyze literature throughout the year. In our Introduction to Literature Unit, we first read Jacqueline Woodson's book, <u>Each</u> <u>Kindness</u>, in which teams connected their prior

knowledge of story elements to important literary terms. Next, we reviewed genres of literature, studied Academic Vocabulary, the concept of Conflict and the beloved Plot Diagram before analyzing the short story, "The Elevator". Armed with a framework of knowledge, LA8 students are ready to dig into all kinds of literature, both in and out of the classroom!

Fifth grade readers had an exciting past week that began with a field trip to Baker Park/Lake Rebecca. Many students enjoyed the experience with a variety of items, whether it be the prey/predator game, or observing animal pelts and skulls, or working together to complete a cooperative activity with their naturalist. 






their book nooks or if they were chosen to have a chair for the day. Fifth grade readers are reading a lot and finishing books towards their "Magic 40!"

7TH GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS-MS. UDALLA



It has been a great start to 7th grade Language Arts. The year started with a review of literature genres and the benefits of reading 20 minutes a night. Seventh grade students have certainly shown their love for reading with

frequent visits to the media center, many books being checked

out from the class library, and their excitement when getting a new sticker upon finishing a book. Please check their folders to see how much they are reading! It's awesome!

We also started "Book Tasting Friday." Every Friday we "taste a portion" of a new book.

Students look forward to hearing a chapter of a new book each Friday. This little taste has encouraged many students to check-out the Friday books and finish reading them. Students are enjoying the read aloud of

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the novel "Starfish" by Lisa Fipps. Not only has this novel given us many opportunities to practice making inferences and finding textual evidence to support our inferences, but it also touches on many issues that are relevant to middle school students. Along with inferencing, there has also been a great focus on vocabulary. Each week students will focus on one or two Latin or Greek roots and prefixes and suffixes. We started the year with three roots - uni, lect, and graph, as well as the prefixes ir- and non-. Students created drawings of many of the words that contain one of the roots or the prefixes. The drawings are added to our word wall inside the classroom. The goal is to have a classroom full of roots which means hundreds of new and familiar words added to each students' vocabulary!
